The offered presentation а blueprint for aspiring project entrepreneurial managers: from ideation to blueprint execution. This involved meticulous planning, market analysis, agile execution, and constant adaptation. However, at its core, belief in oneself emerged as the driving force behind executing ideas.

Highlighting success stories like Tesla's Gigafactories and the presentation Farmable. also showcased how visionary leaders transformed industries by turning ideas into impactful ventures. These success narratives serve as guiding lights for the next generation, inspiring them to embark on this challenging yet rewarding journey.

Furthermore, Mr. Abbiw advocated passionately for mentorship and hands-on experiences to ignite the passion aspiring entrepreneurial of project managers. Realprojects, world mentorship programs, and problem-solving competitions were hailed as catalysts for nurturing the next wave of project management pioneers.

In conclusion, it was emphasized that while making ideas a reality may seem daunting, adopting an entrepreneurial mindset as a project manager opens doors to unparalleled growth.

#### Report on PMI Ghana Chapter Participation at the 2023 Global Summit in Atlanta, Georgia, USA.

The PMI Global Summit 2023, a signature in-person event, unfolded at the Georgia World Congress Centre in Atlanta, Georgia, USA, from October 25 to 28, 2023. Themed "The Future of Your Work," the summit aimed to bring together leaders and project professionals dedicated to turning ideas into reality.

The session brought together leaders and project professionals committed to making ideas a reality. There were over 120 presentation sessions and about 80 speakers to choose from in the 3-day period. The event was attended by more than 3500 delegates including 30 participants from PMI Ghana chapter. There were representatives from ECG, Stanbic Bank, and many more in full attendance.

The first day was dedicated to the PMI Volunteer session. This inviteonly session for volunteers was held at the Georgia World Congress Center. It included updates and addresses by members of the PMI executive leadership team and Board of Directors, along with the presentation of Chapter of the Year Award winners. Following this, there was a 3-hour workshop led by renowned leadership expert Shane Snow. The workshop equipped attendees with the knowledge and skills to become better leaders, coworkers, and volunteers.

With regards to the main programmes, the event kicked off with a delivery from Cassandra Worthy, an author, Founder and CEO of Change Enthusiasm Global. In her high energy keynote address, she shared critical skills that will empower young people to create and sustain growth through change.



### THE STATE OF WOMEN IN PROJECT MANAGEMENT, 2023

Women still hold significantly fewer jobs than their male counterparts, despite global movements equality and diversity, equity and inclusion (DE&I) programs taking hold in the workplace, as noted in our Global Megatrends 2022 report. According to the International Labour Organization (ILO), the global labor force participation rate for women is just under 47%, compared with 72% for men.

This gender gap in employment is even starker in the field of project management where male project managers outnumber female project managers by 3:1, according to recent research from the Project Management Institute (PMI).

While this glaring disparity has immediate negative implications for project teams - 88% of project professionals say having diverse project teams increases value - it may also hold the key to solving an ongoing crisis for organizations. Global labor disruptions triggered by the COVID-19 pandemic persist, impacting a growing demand in management-oriented project employment, where PMI research projects that 25 million new project professionals will be needed by 2030.

current state of women in project management and where opportunities exist for both female workers and organizations, we looked at data from over 1,900 female project professionals who responded to the PMI Annual Global Survey on Project Management in 2022.

**PMI's global snapshot shows:** Maleprojectmanagersoutnumber their female counterparts around the world and in every sector, but the gaps differ greatly by region and industry.

Women earn less than men and are slightly less likely to have a project management certification or a project management degree. While there are far fewer women in the project workforce, they are only slightly less likely than men to have a leadership role.

Women are more likely to report using agile and hybrid approaches, working in organizations that use advanced technologies, and placing a higher value on power skills.

**Global Snapshot** *Average age of respondents:* 40.8 versus 42.6 for men

*Education:* 37% of women have an academic degree in project management versus 42% of men Certification:

- 72% of women hold a project management certification versus 76% of men

- 57% have a PMP versus 64% of men

- 5% have a CAPM versus 2% of men

Average years working in project management: 9.8 versus 11.4 for men

Average years in the workforce: 17.3 versus 19.2 for men

*Employment status:* Women are more likely to work full time for an organization (+5.7%) and less likely to be a consultant/ contractor (-4.6%)

*PMOs:* Women are more likely to work in an organization with a departmental PMO (+1.7%) or both departmental and enterprise PMOs (+4.2%) and less likely to work in an organization with only an enterprise PMO (-6.0%)

Leadership positions: 20% of women vs. 23% of men report some level of management role such as PMO director, portfolio manager or another type of manager (e.g., development, product or functional manager)







